The principal objective of this module is to introduce the learner to the concepts of naturopathic prescribing to be used in a clinical situation. The learner must become used to the basics of naturopathic prescribing – the concept of disease as it relates to symptoms, knowing how to diagnose altered health states in patients and how to prescribe the appropriate medication, therapy or combination management plan. Also discussed in this module are the principles of practice and Case History Taking, having an awareness of orthodox medicine and to be aware of what situations to refer patients for medical testing and/or treatment.
